

Noble Marine RS600 National Championships 2023 Thursday 22nd June 2023 to Sunday 25th June 2023 Hosted by Stone Sailing Club

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

ORGANISING AUTHORITY

This event will be organised by Stone Sailing Club in conjunction with the RS Class Association.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the sailing instructions (SIs) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Racing rules Race Signals AP, 31, 33, 34, 35, 44.1, 60.1(a), 60.1(b), 61.3, 62.1(a), 62.2, A2 A5.1 and A5.2 will be changed. The changes appear, in full, in the notice of race or in these sailing instructions.

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 09:00 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 on the day before it will take effect.

3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located outside of the Sailing Club Race Office adjacent to the entrance.

4 CODE OF CONDUCT

Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole situated on the club race box.

6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 See NoR 9 for schedule.
- 6.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound signal at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.
- 6.3 A fourth race may be run on any day at the discretion of the Race Committee. To indicate this intention the finish boat will display flag Numeral 4 at the end of the third race that day.

7 CLASS FLAGS

The class flag will be RS600 - pink flag with black RS600

8 RACING AREA

See NoR 12.

9 COURSES

- 9.1 Courses to be sailed will be Trapezoid. The diagrams in Addendum A show the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be passed.
- 9.2 The Race Officer will aim for each race to last approximately 45 minutes for the leading boat.
- 9.3 The approximate bearing of the windward mark may be displayed on the Committee boat prior to the warning signal

10 COMMITTEE BOAT & MARKS

- 10.1 The Committee Boat will be a Blue Hanse 45' Yacht called 'Celebration'
- 10.2 The Race Officer for the event is Neil Fulcher
- 10.3 Marks 1,2 3 & 4 will be orange cylindrical buoys. The start/finish mark will be a black cylindrical buoy. You must pass between the black mark and the Committee Boat at the end of each lap.
- 10.2 Hitting a mark other than the start or finish marks will not be penalised. This changes RRS 31.

11 OBSTRUCTIONS

Does not apply

12 THE START

- 12.1 The starting line will be between a mast displaying an orange flag on the Committee Boat at the starboard end and the port-end starting mark
- 12.2 When an inner limit mark is laid near the Committee Boat it is a starting limit mark and shall be left to starboard when starting
- 12.3 A boat that does not start within 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

13 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 13.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position.
- 13.2 Minor course changes may not be signalled. This changes RRS 33.

14 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end finishing mark.

15 PENALTY SYSTEM

See NoR 14.

16 TIME LIMITS

- 16.1 The time limit for all fleets is 75 minutes.
- 16.2 Boats failing to finish within a 20 minute finishing window after the first boat in her class sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A5.1 and A5.2

16.3 In addition to RRS 32, the race committee may also award a finishing score to a boat that is still racing by displaying to her from a committee vessel (which may be in motion) flag W with one sound signal. A boat so notified is no longer required to sail the course, shall stop racing and shall return to the starting area, or return ashore if there is no more racing. A finishing score under this sailing instruction will be the score she would have received had she sailed the course and finished within any time limit, without gaining or losing any place. However, when two or more boats that are overlapped are notified, they will be scored as if they were tied. The decision by the race committee to use this procedure or not to use it shall not be grounds for requesting redress. This changes rules 60.1(b) and 62.1(a).

17 HEARING REQUESTS

- 17.1 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is the later. This changes RRS 61.3 and 62.2.
- 17.2 Hearing Request forms are available at the race office.
- 17.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 17.4 Hearings will be held in the protest room described in the supplementary sailing instructions.

18 SCORING

As per NoR 15.

19 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 19.1 [NP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.
- 19.2 Competitors shall use the tally system provided by the Sailing Club to confirm their intention to race and to record whether they have retired or completed all races at the end of racing.

20 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

20.1 [NP] Substitution of competitors is not allowed without prior written approval of the race committee.

21 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

[NP] A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, notice of race and sailing instructions.

22 SUPPLIED BOATS

Does not apply.

23 OFFICIAL VESSELS

See Supplementary Sailing Instructions.

24. [NP] SUPPORT TEAMS

As per NoR 16.

25 TRASH DISPOSAL

Trash may be placed aboard official or support person vessels.

26 BERTHING

[NP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the dinghy park.

27 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Does not apply.

28 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Does not apply.

29 PRIZES

As per NoR 24.

As per NoR 22.

25 INSURANCE
